

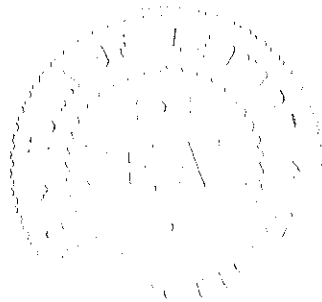
## RECERTIFICATION OF RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION  
APPROPRIATING \$3,500,000 FOR THE  
ROAD QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM 2011-2013  
AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUE OF BONDS AND NOTES  
IN THE SAME AMOUNT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

RESOLVED,

1. That the Town of Ledyard appropriate THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,500,000) for the Road Quality Improvement Program 2011-2013, as contemplated by the Town of Ledyard, CT, Pavement Management Program, Existing Conditions Summary and Capital Improvement Plan, dated February 2011, prepared by BETA Group, Inc. The appropriation may be spent for design and construction costs, equipment, materials, site improvements, engineering fees, land and easement acquisition, project management costs, legal fees, net interest on borrowings and other financing costs, and other expenses related to the project and its financing. Prior to the undertaking of any specific improvements pursuant to this authorization, such portion of the project must be approved by the Planning Commission and the Council. The Town Council is authorized to determine the scope and particulars of the project.

2. That the Town issue bonds or notes in an amount not to exceed THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,500,000) to finance the appropriation for the project. The amount of bonds or notes authorized to be issued shall be reduced by the amount of grants received by the Town for the project. The bonds or notes shall be issued pursuant to Section 7-369 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, Revision of 1958, as amended, and any other enabling acts. The bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the Town secured by the irrevocable pledge of the full faith and credit of the Town.

3. That the Town issue and renew temporary notes from time to time in anticipation of the receipt of the proceeds from the sale of the bonds or notes for the project or the receipt of grants for the project. The amount of the notes or obligations outstanding at any time shall not exceed THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,500,000). The notes shall be issued pursuant to Section 7-378 of the General Statutes of Connecticut, Revision of 1958, as amended. The notes shall be general obligations of the Town and shall be secured by the irrevocable pledge of the full faith and credit of the Town. The Town shall comply with the provisions of Section 7-378a of the General Statutes with respect to any notes that do not mature within the time permitted by said Section 7-378.

4. That the Mayor, the Director of Finance and the Treasurer, or any two of them, of the Town shall sign any bonds or notes by their manual or facsimile signatures. The Treasurer shall keep a record of the bonds or notes. The law firm of Day Pitney LLP is designated as bond counsel to approve the legality of the bonds or notes. The Mayor, the Director of Finance and the Treasurer, or any two of them, are authorized to determine the amounts, dates, interest rates, maturities, redemption provisions, form and other details of the bonds or notes; to designate one or more banks or trust companies to be certifying bank, registrar, transfer agent and paying agent for the bonds or notes; to provide for the keeping of a record of the bonds or notes; to designate a financial advisor to the Town in connection with the sale of the bonds or notes; to sell the bonds or notes at public or private sale; to deliver the bonds or notes; and to perform all other acts which are necessary or appropriate to issue the bonds or notes.

5. That the Town hereby declares its official intent under Federal Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2 and, if applicable, pursuant to Section 54A(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, that project costs may be paid from temporary advances of available funds and that (except to the extent reimbursed from grant moneys) the Town reasonably expects to reimburse any such advances from the proceeds of borrowings, including qualified tax credit bonds, in an aggregate principal amount not in excess of the amount of borrowing authorized above for the project. The Mayor, the Director of Finance and the Treasurer, or any two of them, are authorized to amend such declaration of official intent as they deem necessary or advisable and to bind the Town pursuant to such representations and covenants as they deem necessary or advisable in order to maintain the continued exemption from federal income taxation of interest on the bonds or notes authorized by this resolution, if issued on a tax-exempt basis, including covenants to pay rebates of investment earnings to the United States in future years.


6. That the Mayor, the Director of Finance and the Treasurer, or any two of them, are authorized to make representations and enter into written agreements for the benefit of holders of the bonds or notes to provide secondary market disclosure information, which agreements may include such terms as they deem advisable or appropriate in order to comply with applicable laws or rules pertaining to the sale or purchase of such bonds or notes.

7. That the Mayor and the Town Engineer are authorized to approve design and construction expenditures; and to contract with engineers, contractors and others on behalf of the Town for said project.

8. That the Mayor is authorized to apply for and accept federal and state grants to help finance the appropriation for the project. Any grant proceeds may be used to pay project costs or principal and interest on bonds, notes, or temporary notes.

9. That the Mayor, the Director of Finance, the Treasurer and other proper officers of the Town are authorized to take all other action which is necessary or desirable to complete the project and to issue bonds, notes or other obligations to finance the aforesaid appropriation.
